

# Trees of West Torrens

## Euky dwarf

<b>Botanical name</b>	Eucalyptus leucoxylon 'Euky dwarf'
<b>Family</b>	Myrtaceae
<b>Mature size</b>	5m - 8m high 3m - 5m spread
<b>Trunk girth</b>	230mm - 250mm
<b>Flowers</b>	✓
<b>Fruit/Seeds</b>	✓

### Description

In Adelaide the euky dwarf tree reaches an approximate a height of 5m to 8m and a spread of 3m to 5m after 20 years.

It is a small native tree with an ideal open canopy/form. The euky dwarf is very suited as a street tree and a great choice where height restrictions are a concern. It generally has a single trunk and smooth bark, however typically this tree will shed some bark as it is a eucalypt. The euky dwarf has grey-green leaves that once mature are offset by masses of nectar rich, pink, red and sometimes cream blossoms from late autumn to early summer, attracting native birds to the garden.

This is an ideal street and avenue tree as its natural habit allows for vehicular and pedestrian traffic.

The euky dwarf prefers full sun or light shade and soil types that are well-drained, some clay or sandy loams. Is tolerant of frost and coastal conditions.

### Tree facts

A mature, healthy euky dwarf tree at **8 metres** tall:



**55** of these trees provide enough oxygen for one person for a year.



Provides **20m<sup>2</sup>** of canopy shade, equal to the shade of **6** beach umbrellas.



Removes **71 grams** of harmful air pollution every year.
