

James Congdon Drive and Sir Donald Bradman Drive upgrade

Temporary James Congdon Drive detour

We're making it easier to get from South Road straight to the city

What's happening

Works are progressing well at the intersection of James Congdon Drive and Sir Donald Bradman Drive.

To safely facilitate the next stages of the project, traffic on the southern end of **James Congdon Drive** will be temporarily closed between Sir Donald Bradman Drive and South Road at night with detours in place - see side bar and detour map overleaf for details.

During events at the Adelaide Oval, road closures will begin after 11pm.

How this affects you

Please follow local detour signage and traffic controller instructions. Observe speed limits, lane restrictions and traffic controllers when travelling through the area.

Please plan ahead and expect some delays.

Some noise disturbance can be expected at times while these works are undertaken, however the work will be managed to minimise disturbance to nearby residents and businesses as much as practically possible.

Access to properties will be maintained throughout the works wherever possible via the detour routes, with advance notice provided if there is a need to temporarily restrict driveway access.
