

# James Congdon Drive and Sir Donald Bradman Drive upgrade

## Works notice

### We're making it easier to get from South Road straight to the city

#### What's happening

Works are progressing well at the intersection of James Congdon Drive and Sir Donald Bradman Drive, including the installation of a retaining wall on the southeast corner.

To safely facilitate the next stages of the intersection upgrade, and to minimise the impact to road users, night works will commence mid-June 2025.

#### How this affects you

To keep everyone safe, speed and lane restrictions will be in place as required. Please follow traffic management and onsite signage.

Intermittent temporary closures of side streets in and around the intersection of James Congdon Drive and Sir Donald Bradman Drive may be required, with local signage in place to direct road users.

Pedestrians and cyclists are advised to take care when travelling through the area. For safety reasons, there may be some restricted access. Where required, signage will be in place to direct pedestrians and cyclists to alternative access and/or detours.

Access to properties will be maintained during these works. If short term access restrictions are required, we will provide advance notice. Some noise disturbance can be expected; however, we will minimise as much as practically possible.

The intersection will be fully open to traffic in 2026.
