Night works and temporary road closures

We're making it easier to get from South Road straight to the city

What's happening

Works are progressing well with the next phase of works at the intersection to include road widening, kerbing works, asphaltting work, and lighting and signalling works.

We are also starting construction of the new wombat crossing and Shared Use Path at the slip lane into Railway Terrace, and on the new Rosslyn Street link road.

Temporary road closures

Railway Terrace slip lane

From Sunday 21 September the slip lane into Railway Terrace from the northbound lane of James Congdon Drive will be temporarily closed until early-November 2025. To keep everyone safe the closure is required continuously during the day and at night.

Access to Railway Terrace will be via Hughes Street.

James Congdon Drive closure

From Sunday 28 September 2025 James Congdon Drive between South Road and Sir Donald Bradman Drive will be closed in place for up to three weeks at night only.

The closure, in both directions, will be in place Sunday to Friday between 9pm and 5am, and Thursdays, 10pm to 5am. During Adelaide Oval events, road closures will begin after 11pm. Access will be maintained via detours, please see detour map overleaf for more information.

How this affects you

Some noise disturbance can be expected at times while these works are completed, however the work will be managed to minimise disturbance to nearby residents and businesses as much as practically possible. You might also notice some odours, which is normal during asphalt work.

Properties near the works may have some restricted access at night. We will contact affected property owners, residents, and businesses directly in advance. Please follow local detour signage and traffic controller instructions. Observe speed limits, lane restrictions and traffic controllers when travelling through the area.
