Marion Road and Cross Road Level Crossing Removals Fact sheet - Temporary local access changes

Several temporary changes are required to local access, parking and cyclist and pedestrian access during construction of the Marion Road and Cross Road overpasses in Plympton. These changes are important to keep everyone safe.

Temporary local access changes and road closures from the end of July 2025

Glengyle Terrace

- Between Marion Road and Cross Road will be closed until the project is complete.
- Between Marion Road and Clayton Avenue will become one-way travel only and street parking will be temporarily removed. Some intermittent closures will be required.

Local business access will be maintained.

Pleasant Avenue (between Marion Road and Scott Street)

 Intermittent closures and restrictions to street parking until the project is complete.

Wattle Terrace (between Cross Road and Acacia Street)

 Will become one-way travel only and street parking will be temporarily removed. Some intermittent closures will be required.

Access to properties will be maintained throughout the works via the detour routes. Advance notice will provided if there is a need to temporarily restrict driveway access.

Pedestrian and cyclist access changes

From 1 August 2025, we need to close the Mike Turtur Bikeway, between Wattle Terrace and Mornington Avenue, Plympton Park until the project is complete.

Haulage routes

Haulage routes were selected after careful consideration and planning to reduce impacts on the local community as much as possible.

- deliver materials for earthwork activities
- enable oversized deliveries
- concrete deliveries


