In Adelaide, the box elder maple reaches an approximate a height of 7m to 9m and spread of 4m to 6m after 20 years.

It is an ideal medium sized deciduous tree which is very suitable for avenue plantings due to its Autumn foliage colour ranging from bright red to orange. This tree also works well in large residential gardens.

The flowers of the box elder maple are often described as insignificant - they are long, yellow green and droopy, more like Xmas decoration than traditional blossom.

The box elder maple performs best when grown in full sun and is moderately tolerant of both wet and dry soil conditions. This very hardy maple can even tolerate some coastal conditions. It will also tolerate urban pollution once established.

28 of these trees provide enough oxygen for one person for a year.

Provides **20m**² of canopy shade, equal to the shade of **6** beach umbrellas.

Removes 90 grams of harmful air pollution every year.
