Start of Works - Pedestrian Actuated Crossing

We're making it easier for pedestrians to cross busy main roads

We are delivering a new Pedestrian Actuated Crossing on James Congdon Drive near Hughes Street as part of the National Road Safety Program. This project is jointly funded by the Australian and South Australian governments (50:50).

What's happening

From mid-September 2025, we will be carrying out work to install a new Pedestrian Actuated Crossing (PAC).

The new PAC will:

- Improve safety for pedestrians when crossing James Congdon Drive
- strengthen community connectivity for accessing public transport and local amenities
- improve accessibility for people with mobility impairments to cross James Congdon Drive (the crossing will include an audible warning system to help hearing impaired people to locate and safely use the crossing)
- improve local bike network linkage between local streets and the Adelaide Parklands Trail.

Our work activities will include:

- Installing a fully signalised pedestrian crossing, with new traffic signals
- new pedestrian kerb ramps and medians
- new pedestrian safety fencing
- new line marking.

How this affects you

James Congdon Drive, in the vicinity of the PAC works will remain open to traffic at all times.

Intermittent closures of James Congdon Drive for the Sir Donald Bradman Drive intersection upgrade will continue at night as required, with advance notification provided. We encourage you to sign up to the project email distribution list to stay up to date.

To keep everyone safe, we will have speed and lane restrictions in place throughout the PAC work zone as needed. Please observe onsite signage and directions of traffic controllers.

Works will typically be undertaken in the day Monday to Friday, between 7am and 5pm.

To minimise impacts to traffic some night works may be required. Advance notice will be provided to adjacent residents if night works are required.

There may be some noise during construction as we undertake certain activities, but we will do our best to minimise impacts where possible.

Pedestrian and cyclist access changes

There will be some temporary access changes around our work area. On-site signage will be in place to guide pedestrians and cyclists to the nearest alternative crossing (located approximately 100 metres north on James Congdon Drive).

Please take care when travelling through the area, follow signage and directions of onsite staff for safe access.
